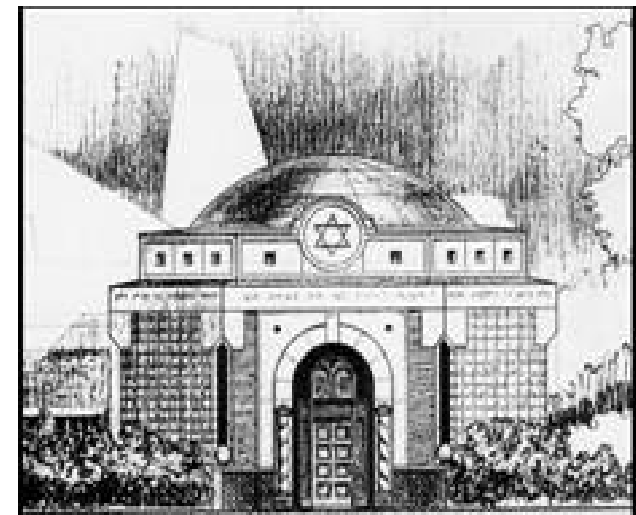

## Shabbat Hol Hamoed Sukkot

Perasha:	Exodus 33:12-34:26	(Page 139 in Festivals book)
Haftarah:	Ezekiel 38:18-39:16	(Page 142 in Festivals book)

For the Shabbat during Sukkot we read the portion following the sin of the golden calf, after Moses pleads on behalf of the People, after G-d agrees to forgive the People, and after Moses smashes the tablets and destroys the Golden Calf. Moses asks for greater knowledge and intimacy with G-d. G-d gives Moses greater glimpses of His Essence than He had previously shown, but only a glimpse. Then G-d commands Moses to make a new set of Commandments, which He will engrave as He had previously done with the first set. We then read about the 13 Divine Attributes of G-d.

The Haftarah of Shabbat Hol Hamoed comes from Ezekiel. Ezekiel describes a battle in the end of time (before the coming of the Mashiach) when armies hostile to the Jewish People will attack and be thwarted by G-d. The defeat will result in the worldwide acknowledgement of the greatness of the G-d of Israel as the One G-d. There is a tradition that this war will occur on Sukkot, hence its choice as the Haftarah.
