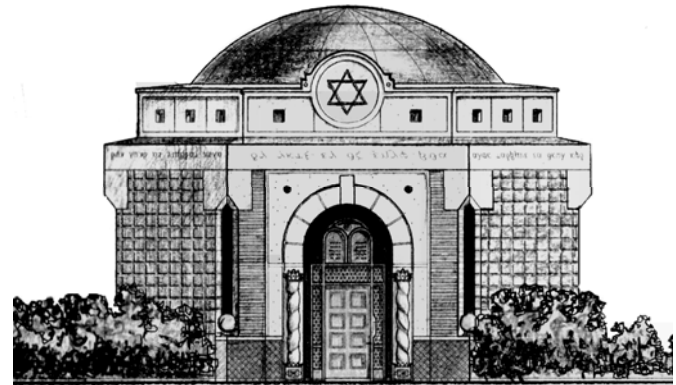

Perashat Terumah contains a list of raw materials necessary for building the Mishkan, which was presented to the Children of Israel: gold, silver, copper, wool dyed sky-blue, dark red, and crimson, linen, natural goats wool, ram skins, acacia wood, oil, spices, incense, and precious stones. Then the various parts of the Mishkan are described; the Ark and its cover; the Shulchan (table) and the showbread; the Menorah and her utensils; the Parochet (dividing partition separating the Holy of Holies from the rest of the Mishkan); the ramped, copper, Mizbayach (altar) and the outer enclosure surrounding the entire Mishkan.

The Haftarah describes the preparation for the building of the first Beit HaMikdash, much like the Torah presents the preparation for the building of the Mishkan. One can notice differences between the building of the Mishkan and the building of the Beit HaMikdash, especially on the participation of the people. In the case of the Mishkan, there was a high level of enthusiasm and volunteerism that even had Moses begging the people to stop bringing materials. In the case of the Beit HaMikdash, there were conscriptions of labor forces to do some of the work and to supply the materials.
