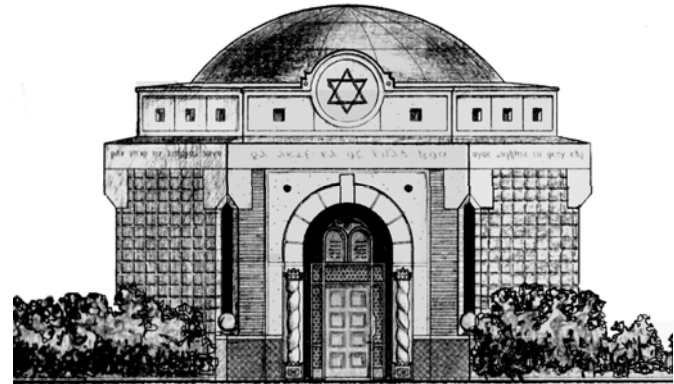

Perasha:	Leviticus 6:1-8:36	(Page 429)
Haftarah:	Malachi 3:4-24	(Page 1005)

After the preliminary descriptions of the different korbanot (sacrifices) from last week's Perasha, we now find the description of the daily service in the Mikdash. Having set down the rules, G-d now commands Moses to take Aaron and his sons, the garments of the Kohanim, the sacrificial animals, and the anointing oil, and perform the inaugural ceremonies for the Mishkan in the presence of the People.

The Haftarah speaks of faithfulness to Torah, and the promise of the coming of Eliyahu as the harbinger of redemption. That the second point, to some extent, depends on the first, can be seen in the closeness of the following two phrases: "Remember the Torah, and keep it; and if you do, then I will send Eliyahu."
