Perashat Devarim

Perasha:	Deuteronomy	1:1-3:22	(Page 736)
Haftara:	Isaiah	1:1-27	(Page 750)

This week's perasha is the first of the book of Deuteronomy. We begin with Moshe's farewell speech to the people. He reviews their journey from Sinai to the Promised Land. He recalls the difficulties, the wandering, and the conflicts that the people have had. He reminds the tribes of Reuben and Gad the stipulation of their agreement. Moshe's speech ends with his naming of Joshua as his successor to lead the people.

In our haftarah this week, the prophet Isaiah speaks of the accumulation of terrible sins and acts of unfaithfulness to G-d which led to the destruction of Zion and Jerusalem. Isaiah criticizes the Judeans for their weaknesses, but tells them that there is still time to change their ways. They must make religion a priority in their lives. G-d will punish them, but through the punishment, they will come to be a good people again.
