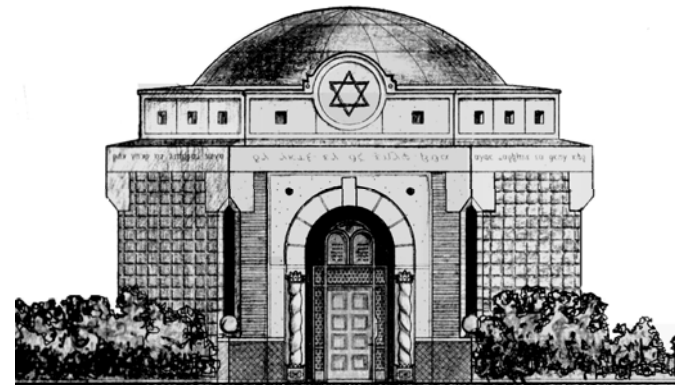

Perashat Pinchas

Perasha:	Numbers 25:10-30:1	(Page 686)
Haftara:	Jeremiah 1:1-2:3	(Page 710)

This week's Perasha refers to five different issues. The first is Pinchas being rewarded with the High Priesthood. The second is the taking of the second census of the Israelites. Next is the issue of women's rights of inheritance. The fourth is G-d instructing Moses to go up to Mount Abarim so that he may get a good view of the Land of Israel since he was not allowed to cross over into it. Our Perasha ends with a description of the various sacrifices to be brought to the Tabernacle.

In our Haftarah, we are told of Jeremiah's visions of an almond tree and the "boiling pot", representing the enemy from the north who will come to destroy Jerusalem. This prophecy of destruction, because of idolatry and unfaithfulness, sets the tone for the three-week mourning period for the Beit HaMikdash. The concluding section of the Haftarah tells of the promise that G-d will punish those who rise against Israel, for Israel – despite its sins – is holy and special to G-d.
