centerpieces, bat mitzvah dresses, decorations and accessories.

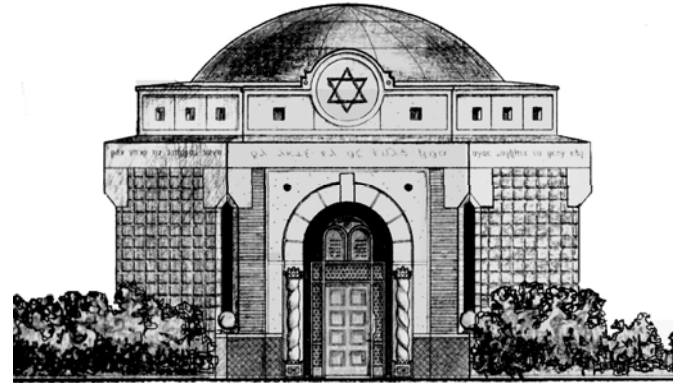

Shabbat Perashat Ki Tetze

Perasha:	Deuteronomy	21:10-25:19	(page 840)
Haftarah:	Isaiah	54:1-10	(page 857)

Following the instructions at the end of last week's Perasha as to how the Jew is to wage war, Moses, in Perashat Ki Tetze, presents 74 mitzvot which highlight the value that the Torah places on the private domain of person and property. His topics include the laws regarding: hanging and burial, forbidden combinations, tzitzit, the defamed wife, the penalty for adultery, the rape of a betrothed or unmarried girl, the prohibition against marrying a father's wife, the bastard, prostitution, and the laws regarding paying wages on time.

The Haftarah for this week comes from Chapter 54 in Isaiah. It prophesies an end to the Exile, and reconciliation between the People of Israel and G-d. G-d is likened to the husband of His estranged wife, Israel. The couple will reconcile, so to speak. G-d says that the Exile is to Israel as the Flood was to Noah. He promises no more exile. No more anger. The Exile was temporary. G-d's love for the people of Israel is everlasting.
