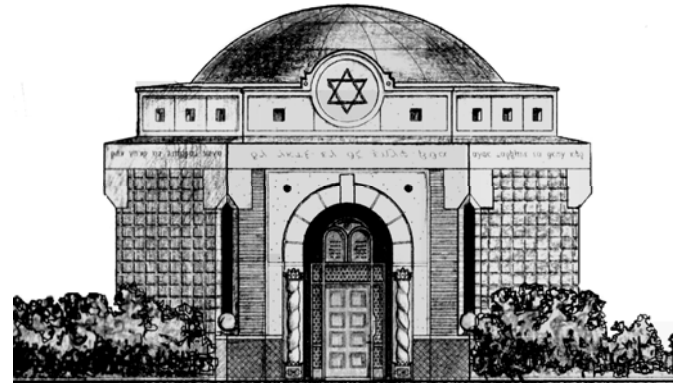

Moshe continues his farewell words to the People. He tells them that he had asked G-d to rescind His decree banning Moshe from entry into the Land of Israel and that G-d refused. He includes a review of the Ten Commandments and various laws and reminds the people not to forget what they experienced at Mt. Sinai. Moshe then stresses the Shema message. Moshe forewarns them about the dangers of assimilation and tells them to always remember that they are the Chosen People.

In this week's Haftarah, G-d commands the prophets (through Isaiah) to bring the message of comfort and of the end of Babylonian captivity. Isaiah assures the exiles that G-d has forgiven them for the wrongs that had been committed in the past.

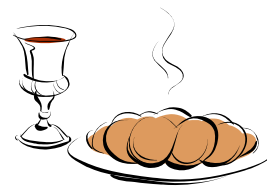
