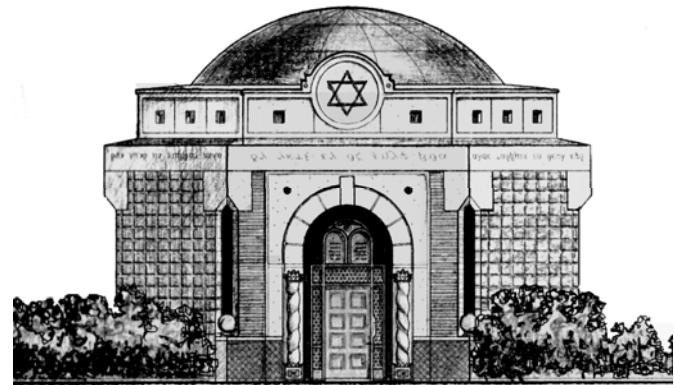

Shabbat Perashiyot Nitzavim-Vayelech

Perasha:	Deuteronomy	29:9-31:30	(page 878)
Haftarah:	Isaiah	61:10-63:9	(page 883)

In our joint Perashiyot this week, Moses confronts the primary excuses we all use in avoiding commitment and responsibility. He makes it absolutely clear that each generation is obligated to educate their children and teach them to accept the covenant with G-d. Subsequent generations should not be able to excuse their responsibilities for Torah and Mitzvot due to ignorance. Moses presents the bottom line: endowed with free will, we must choose properly. In the end, we are responsible for what happens. Moses concludes his words to the People and tells them that at his age of 120 years, he is no longer able to lead them, and that G-d has told Moses that he will not be crossing the Jordan River, so his journey is truly over. He tells them that G-d will be with them, destroy the nations that they will encounter in Eretz Israel, and that Joshua will be the one to lead them.

In this week's Haftarah, Isaiah prophesizes of the time to come when there will be universal peace and Jerusalem will not only be rebuilt, but will be the center of universal worship of G-d. Not only will the nations of the world recognize The One G-d, they will also acknowledge the People of Israel as His People. The idea of universal acceptance of G-d fits well with our notion that ALL people are judged by G-d on Rosh Hashanah, not just the Jewish People.
