Shabbat Sukkot

Perasha:	Leviticus 23:1 - 26	(Page 131 in Festivals book)
Haftarah:	Zachariah 14	(Page 136 in Festivals book)

This chapter gives a comprehensive description of the sacred seasons in the Jewish year. There is no mention of the New Moon, because it was not necessarily a day of cessation from work, and was not ranked as one of the “holy convocations”. The sacrifices for each Festival are given in Numbers 28.

This chapter is an apocalyptic vision of the salvation of Jerusalem and judgment upon the heathen nations which had attacked her, a judgment effected by earthquake and plague, the manifestations of G-d’s personal intervention. It will be a final judgment; the nations will be converted to the worship of the G-d of Israel, so that ‘in that day shall the Lord be One, and His name One’; and Jerusalem, elevated into the religious center of the world, will be a place of pilgrimage for all nations, who will assemble there each year to observe the Feast of Tabernacles.
