Perashat Korach

Perasha:	Numbers 16:1-18:32	(Page 639)
Maftir	Numbers 28:9-15	(Page 695)
Haftarah:	Isaiah 66:1	(page 944)

In this week's Perasha we read about Korach and how he, along with Dattan, Aviram, and 250 men from the camp of Reuven, challenged Moshe and Aaron's leadership. Moses set the next day for a showdown, hoping that the rebels would reconsider their rebellion. After attempting to convince Korach to reconsider, Moses's efforts were rebuffed. The next day G-d instructed Moses and the nation to separate themselves from the tents of Korach, Dattan, and Aviram. Then the entire families of Korach were swallowed up by the earth, while the 250 men from Reuven were consumed by a heavenly fire. A rebellion broke out among the people, and Aaron had to intervene in order to stop the plague sent as a punishment against the people. Aaron's appointment as Kohane Gadol is reconfirmed through the test of the staffs. Aaron's staff was the only staff that miraculously sprouted almonds. Aaron's staff is placed in the Holy of Holies. The duties of the Kohanim and Leviim are stated along with a list of the Kohane's share in the nations produce and livestock, the Levite's share of the nation's produce, and the gifts given by the Leviim to the Kohanim.

In the verses that we read today in honor of Rosh Hodesh, we are reminded that G-d's presence cannot be limited to one spot. No matter where we are, G-d is there with us.
