Shabbat Perashat Shelach

Perasha: Numbers 13:1-15:41 (page 623)

Haftarah: Joshua 2:1-24 (page 635)

In this week's Perasha, Moses sends 12 spies to scout out the land. The spies return carrying the massive fruits of the land. They also deliver a negative report, causing the nation to lose its faith in G-d and Moses. Moses successfully argues for the life of the nation, and G-d decided to issue the 40-year decree of wandering in the desert until all those who came out of Egypt and doubted him die. The laws of Mincha and sin offerings are introduced, as well as the mitzvah of Challah.

Paralleling and contrasting with the Perasha, the Haftarah tells us of two other spies (Kalev and Pinchas) who were sent by Joshua into Jericho. Rahav, who had heard of the wonders that happened to the People of Israel, protects the spies from the men who are searching for them. In exchange for her protection, Rahav receives a promise that she and her family will be spared when the Israelite army attacks the city. Tradition tells us that Rahav subsequently became a sincere convert to Judaism and the wife of Joshua. In one case, the spies were our undoing. In the other, they served a very positive function.
